Over the coffee break tutor Brian passed on some useful hints on the proper action to follow when gouging using hand pressure and also about when to use a paring gouge which has the bevel to the front and cuts on the back edge.

- JANET:** Still extracting a Green Man face from jelatong. [Janet demonstrated an easy method of judging depth of cuts that husband George had devised.]
- PAT B:** Pat was preparing some basic bird and frog shapes for the whittling class he conducts at U3A.
- RACHAEL:** Carving a pine Madonna which she hopes to take to back to her birth country.
- BRUCE:** Still fine tuning a jelatong nude with intimate detailed fingers and toes.
- BRYAN:** Starting on a very intricate mirror surround carving.
- DEREK:** Sanding off two red cedar doves

[Beautiful Hand-Made Wooden Vespa](#)



The Vespa scooter has a classically appreciable shape. Portuguese craftsman Carlos Alberto managed to fashion one from laminated hardwood. The result is stunningly beautiful.

The little scooter is based on an original Vespa which had fallen into complete disrepair, but using long-tested woodcraft techniques a flowing new body was constructed for the runabout. The main spine of the bike is fashioned from steam bent and laminated veneers upon which very nicely carved body work hangs. Even the package tray and seat are made from wood.
