The forty or so members at the June 4th meeting were privileged to learn something of the life of comparative new carving member THANH DUONG and watch a slide show of the variety of artistic works and activities undertaken by her since her arrival in Melbourne as a girl with her family escaping from Vietnam back in 1980.

Before venturing into wood carving she had obtained a Batchelor of Fine Arts and shown great talent in a variety of mediums from Chinese painting on rice paper through acrylics to murals. From there she worked her way through every form of sculpture, clay, bronze and stone, and now into wood. Many examples of her work were on display and attracted much interest over supper.

Bryan Thompson thanked Thanh for her presentation and President Bruce welcomed her as another multi tasked talent to the Club.


