Health and safety issues were covered by David with particular emphasis on dust avoidance and proper use of the workplace ducted extractors. He also drew attention to

the Safe Work Procedure certificates now prominent at each work station around the room.

Continuing member profiles the President called JohnTarry, a committee man for 13 years, to the microphone to tell of his background and how he had become a wood turner. We learnt that John, with little woodworking background, had joined the Club about 15 years ago and had fallen in love with the art after his first proud effort making a candlestick holder. His skill improved so well that he was soon asked to be an instructor and has been running the Wednesday afternoon group ever since. The marvellous work his wife Sandra has done in creating and maintaining the Club's library was mentioned and both earned a round of applause.

At this point Charles was called on to introduce three members from the SES [State Emergency Service] Brian, Chris and Sue each dressed in their orange working uniform to better inform us of the extent of the valuable work this voluntary service is called upon to do in storms, floods and many other trying times. This they did very professionally with talks, a video presentation and the handing out of literature with emphasis on a check list for before, during and after an emergency. Many questions followed before Charles thanked them with the usual small gift.
